## **DIRECTIONS TO SHOWGROUND**

**Please note if you have a SATNAV (EX6 8JQ) it may direct you around the back of Powderham. Make sure you stay on the A379 and go PAST THE MAIN ENTRANCE GATES.**

From the South – Leave the A38 at the “Wobbly Wheel Junction” and merge onto the A379 (signposted Dawlish). At the Marsh Barton roundabout take 3<sup>rd</sup> exit onto the A379 then at the Matford roundabout take the 2<sup>nd</sup> exit onto the A379 and follow the Powderham Castle brown tourist signs, Continue **PAST** the main gates to the Castle and through the traffic lights, continue on this road and turn left just in front of village sign for Starcross. Go past the grey lodge house on your left, the showground entrance is the 2<sup>nd</sup> gate on the left, about ¼ mile along that road.

From the North – leave the M5 at Junction 30 and proceed towards Exeter joining the A379. At the Matford roundabout take the 1st exit onto the A379 signposted Dawlish then follow the Powderham Castle brown tourist signs. Continue **PAST** the main gates to the Castle and through the traffic lights continue on this road and turn left just in front of village sign for Starcross. Go past the grey lodge house on your left, the showground entrance is the 2<sup>nd</sup> gate on the left, about ¼ mile along that road.

# CLASSES

*Open to mares and geldings only.*

## In Hand Classes

***Handlers of ponies in In Hand classes aged 14 years and under must wear correctly secured current British standard skull caps/riding hats.***

- Class 70 Young handler 7 to 11 years – age at 1<sup>st</sup> January of the current year.
- Class 71 Young handler 12 to 15 years – age at 1<sup>st</sup> January of the current year.
- Class 72 Coloured horse or pony. All non-solid coloured horses/ponies allowed.
- Class 73 Hunter-type horse/pony, any height.
- Class 74 Mountain Moorland (type) pony. Need not be pure bred but must be of native type.
- Class 75 Mountain & Moorland registered ponies.
- Class 76 Riding Horse/Cob/Arab horse or pony.
- Class 77 Veteran horse/pony. Animal to be aged 15 years or over on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2018
- Class 78 Cob or cob-type.
- Class 79 Best 1,2,3 year old. Rosette to best exhibit in each age group.

## UNAFFILIATED IN HAND CHAMPIONSHIP

***All first prize winners from classes 70 to 79 are eligible to compete for the Unaffiliated In Hand Championship***

### Ridden classes – not before 1.00pm

***All ponies competing in ridden classes must be four years old or over.***

***Riders must have attained their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday by 1 January of current year and when led, leaders must have attained their 10<sup>th</sup> birthday by 1<sup>st</sup> January of the current year. Leaders of ponies in ridden classes aged 14 years and under must wear correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats.***

- Class 80 Lead Rein. Pony not to exceed 12.2hh and rider to have attained their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday by 1<sup>st</sup> January of the current year and 9 years old or under, the leader to must have attained their 16<sup>th</sup> birthday by 1<sup>st</sup> January of the current year.
- Class 81 First Ridden. Pony not to exceed 13hh. Rider to be 12 years old or under as at 1<sup>st</sup> January of the current year.
- Class 82 Mountain & Moorland type pony. Need not be pure bred but must be of native type. Rider may be led. **May not enter if entered in Class 83**
- Class 83 Mountain & Moorland registered pony. Must be pure breed and registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud. Rider may be led. **May not enter if entered in Class 82**

- Class 84 Riding Club/Cob/Arab horse or pony. Open to all Riding Club type horse/ponies.
- Class 85 Coloured horse or pony. Rider may be led. All non-solid colours allowed.
- Class 86 Ridden cob/cob type.
- Class 87 Veteran horse/pony. Animal to be aged 15 years or over on 1<sup>st</sup> January of the current year.
- Class 88 Best combination. Open to all. Ridden or maybe led.
- Class 89 Best local combination. Horse/pony must be stabled within 10 miles of the showground. Ridden or maybe led.

**PARENTS PLEASE BE AWARE that there will be official photographers at this show and if you do not want your children photographed you must make your own arrangements. Only the official photographers are allowed in the rings.**

## **RULES**

1. The Organisers and each of the Show's officers, servants or agents shall not be in any way responsible or accountable for any loss, injury or damage that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatever) to exhibitors or their servants or agents or other members of the public, to any animal or property or to any vehicle brought onto the Showground, or on premises used in conjunction with the Show, or while entering or leaving the same or otherwise for anything else in conjunction with, or arising out of, or attributable to the Show.
2. The decision of the judge is final. Any member or exhibitor wishing to lodge a protest having reference to any person or exhibit shall do so in writing to the Show Secretary and shall at the same time deposit the sum of £10. If on investigation by the Show Committee the protest is not sustained, the deposit will be forfeited to the funds of the Show. All protests shall be delivered within half an hour of the incident.
3. It is the Exhibitors' responsibility to ensure they are ready to enter the ring at the appropriate time. Classes will not be held up for any reason. The organisers will not be responsible for any clashes.
4. Ponies must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor or officially leased.
5. Correctly secured BS Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos PAS015, EN1384(USA), ASTM F1163 that meet current safety standards must be worn by Riders at all times when mounted. Spurs are not permitted. Showing canes can be no more than 30 inches long.
6. All dogs must be kept on a lead.
7. Exhibitors are requested not to bring any coughing pony to the Show and may be requested to remove any such animal.
8. No change of rider/handler will be allowed throughout the class without the judge's permission.
9. Handlers of ponies in In Hand classes aged 14 years and under must wear correctly secured current British standard skull caps/riding hats.
10. The show committee strongly recommends that competitors have adequate third party insurance.
11. Children aged 16 years and under to be accompanied at the Show by an adult.
