Class 28 : Best Coloured Standard Open. (Classes 27&28 may be amalgamated if insufficient entries.)

OPEN RIDDEN AND YOUNG HANDLERS

Judge: Mrs C Pearse - Uphill

- Class 29 : Young Handler, 7 – 11 years.
Class 30 : Young Handler, 12 – 16 years.

No stallions or colts in classes 29 & 30. Competitors aged 14 and under must wear a hard hat. The two highest placed SWA members in classes 29 & 30 will qualify for SWA Young Handler of the Year (Final to be held at SWA Bronze Medal Show, Stretcholt EC on 18th November 2018) and NPAC Young Handler of the Year final.

- Class 31 : Leading rein up to 12.2hh. Rider 8 yrs and under.
Class 32 : First Ridden up to 13.2 hh. Rider 12 years and under.
Class 33 : Novice ridden. Not to have won a 1st prize before 1st January 2018
Class 34 : Welsh Section A & Section B
Class 35 : Welsh Section C & Section D
Class 36 : M&M Ridden - to be split into large and small if sufficient entries.
Class 37 : Part Bred M&M Ridden
Class 38 : Coloured Ridden
Class 39 : Best Combination 12 years and under.
Class 40 : Best Combination 13 years and over.

RIDDEN CHAMPIONSHIP

Perpetual Clanfield Trophy

1st & 2nd prize winners' classes 31-40 are eligible

***** SUPREME IN SHOW CHAMPIONSHIP *****

TOR-Y-MYNYDD TROPHY

In Hand & Ridden Champions & Reserve Champions are eligible

RULES

1. The Organisers and Show's officers, servants or agents shall not be in any way responsible or accountable for any loss, injury or damage from any cause or circumstances whatever to exhibitors or their servants or agents or other members of the public, to any animal or property or any vehicle or otherwise brought onto the showground, or on premises used in conjunction with the show or while entering or leaving the same or otherwise for anything else in conjunction with, or arising out of, or attributable to the Show.
2. The decision of the Judge is final and the Organisers reserve the right to amend the Judge's panel and order of classes if it should become necessary.
3. The Committee reserves the right to cancel/amalgamate any class with less than three entries.
4. The Committee reserves the right to retain all or part of the entry fees in the event of the show being cancelled.
5. Any protest shall be lodged in writing with the Show Secretary within half an hour of the incident together with a deposit of £10. If the protest is not upheld, the deposit will be forfeited to the funds of the show.
4. All entries in classes 1 to 28 must be entered in the appropriate section of the stud book for their respective breeds. ***All stud book registration numbers must be given on all entry forms.***

7. Correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats must be worn at all times when mounted. Spurs are not permitted and no cane to be more than 30 inches.
8. NO MANES OR TAILS TO BE PLAIDED IN ANY M&M CLASS, OPTIONAL FOR PART-BREDS.
9. No nominations or substitutions will be made.
10. Ponies must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or officially leased.
11. No change of handler may be made once a class has commenced without the permission of the judge.
12. Stallions must be licensed in accordance with breed regulations.
13. The show committee strongly recommends that all competitors have adequate third party insurance.
14. Competitors entering classes which may clash do so at their own risk, no entry fees will be refunded. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure they are ready to enter the ring at the appropriate time.
15. NPS rules regarding age of handlers/riders of stallions apply. Handlers of ponies in all In Hand classes aged 14 years and under must wear correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats.
16. Ponies must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor or officially leased.
17. All dogs must be kept under control and on a lead at all times.
18. Exhibitors must not enter an animal when that animal will be judged by a person who has or has had any financial interest in the animal, stud fee excluded, (the exhibitor being the owner, lessee or person producing and/or showing the animal). Judges may not adjudicate a pony which, to the judge's knowledge, is a pony bred, sold, leased or produced by the judge or his immediate family or employer.
19. Exhibitors are requested not to bring any coughing pony to the show and may be requested to remove any such animal.
20. **All cups and trophies remain the property of the South Western Association of the Welsh Pony & Cob Society and must be returned to the show secretary. They may only be signed for by an adult SWA member ON RECEIPT OF A £10 DEPOSIT and remain the responsibility of the winner whilst in their possession. They may only be signed for and collected by an adult. Any person who has had an SWA cup or trophy in the past and has not returned it by the time of the next show may not be allowed to take away a cup or trophy they have won**
21. Refund of entry fee only on receipt of a veterinary certificate.

EXTRA RULES FOR SHETLAND CLASSES 21 TO 28

22. Classes must be confined to Registered Ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or eligible for registration (.ie. Foals).
23. Three year old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show. All entire males aged 2 years and over must display a stallion disc.
24. There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interest of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.

PARENTS PLEASE BE AWARE that there may be photographers at the show and if you do not want your children photographed you must make your own arrangements.

Only official photographers are permitted in the ring.
